

CARDINAL CRUSH POLICIES FORM 2016

Cardinal Crush NO TOLERANCE Policy:

Cardinal Crush has NO TOLERANCE for bad/inappropriate behavior from any member of Cardinal Crush during ALL Cardinal Crush events including meetings, tournaments, and practices. Cardinal Crush wants every child to be part of a positive environment and safe from negative criticism from peers, coaches, and parents. All adults should be a role models for the girls and teach the girls to respect their coaches, parents, refs, scorekeepers, line judges, each other and be a team player at all times.

Players: Are expected to be on their best behavior during ALL Cardinal Crush Events including tournaments, practices, and tournaments the girls are not playing in. Inappropriate behavior and gestures will not be allowed. Any child caught going against the NO TOLERANCE Policy will be asked to sit out of practice and/or tournament play if the coach feels it is warranted. Players are expected to be a Team Player and encourage their team members not criticize them.

Players are expected to attend all practices. If a player is not able to attend a practice the coach must be informed the player will not be at practice and why. Missing practices at any age level will affect the amount of playing time a child is given during games, which is up to the individual coach.

Parents: During tournaments only positive cheering is encouraged. The players on the court are learning and don't need negative remarks from the sidelines during tournaments and/or practices. This can make young girls feel a lack of confidence and affect their abilities. Respect our coaches during games/practices. Address any concerns you may have with the coach during an appropriate time and place. Let the coaches do the coaching during practices/tournaments this will be less confusing for the girls because they are to listen and respect their coaches. The coaches are volunteers and we need them in order to have an organization so young girls can learn and play the wonderful sport of volleyball. If you wish to coach a team we are always looking for coaches for the upcoming season.

Parents are expected to have their children to practice a couple minutes early and on a regular basis so the child has time to get their shoes on and get right to practice.

Coaches: Coaches are expected to keep their team parents informed of all practices, tournaments, and any important information. Coaches are expected to be role models for the girls. Coaches are to make practices fun while teaching the girls proper volleyball skills in a environment safe from negativity. Coaches are expected to be on-time for ALL practices if they are unable to be on-time they must find other arrangements to have someone in their place. Practices should be run efficiently. Coaches have the right to sit a player out of practice and/or tournament play if a player is not following the Cardinal Crush NO TOLERANCE Policy if the Coach feels it is warranted and/or if the child is missing practices. Before a Coach can sit the player for not following the NO TOLERANCE Policy the coach must give a verbal warning to the child. And if after the coach has spoken to the child and the issues have not been corrected by the player the coach may sit the child out of practice and/or tournament play as the Coach sees

necessary. When a coach removes a child from practice or play the coach must inform the parent of this event and explain why and what steps need to be taken before the child can resume activity with the team. If the act is extreme enough the coach has the right to approach the board with concerns about a child which may be reviewed by the board for possible removal from the program. Any child that is removed from the program may not participate in any Cardinal Crush activities for the rest of the season. If the removal happens after April 15th of the current season the child will not be allowed to participate in the following season as well.

Cardinal Crush No Tolerance: Cardinal Crush reserves the right to have any person(s) removed from the program who do not follow the Cardinal Crush NO TOLERANCE Policy and/or any other Policy in place. Cardinal Crush reserves the right to change and add Policies to the program as the board sees fit.

Cardinal Crush Work Policy:

Cardinal Crush is a non-profit organization organized solely by volunteers including parents and members of the community. Without these volunteers Cardinal Crush would fold. When registering your daughter in Cardinal Crush you are agreeing as a parent to fill your families obligation to the Cardinal Crush Work Policy. For each daughter registered in Cardinal Crush a minimum of 5 hours of tournament work at a non-team participating tournament and setup/cleanup for any participating tournament per child MUST be completed to satisfy the Cardinal Crush Work Policy. Any family who does not complete their work duties will be billed \$100.00 per child immediately and their child will not be allowed to participate in any Crush activities until it is paid in full. If the missed shift is at the end of the season your child will not be allowed to be registered for the upcoming season until fee has been paid in full. This Policy is in place to guarantee parental help throughout the season to be sure the girls registered in Cardinal Crush will have a smooth and successful season and the board can provide proper well maintained equipment for the girls to use while playing the sport they love.

Work time will be automatically scheduled in advance. If you need to switch a volunteer time slot you are responsible to find a replacement and let Kelly Crawford at cardinalcrush@gmail.com know of the change.

Cardinal Crush Fundraiser Policy (if applicable): No FUNDRAISER for 2016

When registering your daughter with Cardinal Crush you are agreeing to the Cardinal Crush Fundraiser Policy. For each daughter registered in Cardinal Crush a fundraiser must be completed for the season. If you choose to not participate in the Cardinal Crush fundraiser Cardinal Crush does offer the family a buyout option per child depending on the fundraiser. This Policy is in place to help offset WIVL cost for playing in tournaments and help keep well maintained equipment for the girls to use while playing the sport they love. Fundraising will be evaluated each year by the board. If the board decides to do a fundraiser the board must inform participants during registration for the season.

Non-Refundable Registration Policy:

Cardinal Crush has a non-refundable registration policy on all registrations.
